rea Agencies on Aging (AAAs) are the on-the-ground organizations charged through the federal Older Americans Act with helping older adults live with independence and dignity in their homes and communities. More than 600 AAAs operate in virtually every community in the nation.

While all AAAs serve older adults and caregivers, many AAAs also provide services and supports to other related groups.

Serve individuals younger 8% than 60 who have a disability, impairment or chronic illness.



Provide programming targeted 4% at people living with dementia and their caregivers.



Serve people with dementia of all ages (including under 60).



Offer programming to support 2% the needs of grandparents caring for grandchildren.




On average, AAAs provide 27 services to help ensure older adults have the supports they need to continue living at home and in their communities for as long as possible.





Affordable and accessible housing is essential for older adults who wish to remain in their homes and communities as they age. As a result,


