n4a 2017 Excellence in Leadership Award

Purpose:

The purpose of this award is to recognize AAA and Title VI Directors, staff or Board/Advisory Council members who have demonstrated exceptional leadership capabilities. The work of the award winner shall be evidence of outstanding leadership at the local, state and/or national level in advancing the mission of the Older Americans Act and preparing communities for the rapidly aging population.

Nomination Process:

Nominations are encouraged from AAAs and Title VI Native American aging programs that are members of n4a, and that complete and submit the required nomination form. The n4a Excellence in Leadership Award(s) is presented at the n4a Annual Conference.

Selection of the Recipient:

One AAA recipient and one Title VI recipient will be eligible for selection. The Executive Committee of the n4a Board of Directors will review nominations according to the following criteria:

- 50 percent—demonstrated leadership at the local, state or national level; and
- 50 percent—significant impact in the area of aging advocacy, program or policy development, planning for livable communities, cultural competency enhancement or services and/or systems design.

The nominator of the Award winner will be notified in advance of n4a's 42nd Annual Conference & Tradeshow in Savannah, GA, where the Award will be presented.
